Large Language Model Policy

Jay does not use LLM technology (often popularly and mistakenly called “AI”) for any websites, nor does he permit its use for client-generated content. Jay’s work, the client’s business, and you the site visitor deserve better than that. The only way to ensure functional, efficient, and original programming services is to do it the right way.

Religious Freedom Statement

This is the opinion of Jay only, and does not necessarily reflect the opinions of our clients. Nothing in this statement should be seen as legal advice.

In 2023, the United States Supreme Court ruled in *303 Creative LLC v. Elenis* that no organization could be compelled to create art in violation of religiously informed conscience – specifically with regard to sexual orientation and gender identity. As a Christian, Jay appreciates this freedom afforded to us in the United States. However, Christians are commanded by our Lord and Savior not to use this freedom to deny service (Matthew 5:41). Put simply, while people may have a legal right to discriminate, Jay does not believe we have a biblical right to discriminate. As such, *everyone is welcome as a customer*.

As such, unlike 303 Creative, Jay is proud *not* to deny service to anyone on the basis of his beliefs. Following the example of Jesus Christ, every opportunity for service is a command to service. Instead, Jay cautions clients that one’s creative abilities are a gift from the very God that invented morality and is there subject to Him. This will reflect for better or for worse whenever Jay is commissioned.

Christians believe “the Gospel”, that every person is by default an enemy of their creator because of a nature prone to self-idolatry, and is therefore obligated to accept God’s sacrifice of Himself on a cross as the propitiation for this separation. Everyone accepting this covenant is then adopted as God’s child and obligated to do as He commands.

Jay believes, as Jesus Christ taught, that this message is best communicated in service, not in pearl-clutching exclusions. Service to one’s enemies cedes no ground to them – quite the contrary (Matthew 5:43-48). Jay does, however, reserve the right to not use any sexually suggestive imagery in any context. He believes this to also be consistent with Christ’s commands (1 Thessalonians 4:1-7). He will also not promote illegal activities (Romans 13:1).
